On behalf of the Prince George Public Library Board, I'm pleased to share a few highlights from 2018. PGPL staff welcomed 309,145 visitors into our two branches last year, and assisted citizens in borrowing 861,392 items from our collections.

In partnership with the Community Arts Council, we hosted our first annual Teen Art Showcase. For some of the 28 participants, it was the first time ever publicly exhibiting their art. New literacy programming included Read to Me in French, story time in French, and Reading Buddies – a program pairing teen volunteers with elementary students.

We launched our new library outreach vehicle in June; citizens might have seen the van at National Indigenous People's Day, Canada Day festivities, the Pride Parade, Downtown Summerfest, or at various schools, daycares and outreach events. We faced an unexpected challenge in June, when a fire in a restaurant adjacent to the Nechako Branch forced a thirteen day closure. Thankfully, we were able to deploy the outreach van to offer limited services in the Hart.

Citizen engagement remained a priority for the library in 2018. We partnered with local organizations to promote discussion around electoral reform. We also partnered with the Prince George Citizen and CBC during the municipal and school board elections, hosting an all candidates forum, Candi-Dating (for City council candidates), and Coffee with the Candidates (for Board of Education candidates).

We gratefully acknowledge the support of our funders, donors, sponsors, partners and volunteers for helping us to provide the services, programs, and resources that enrich our community.



We have **58,188** library cardholders!


We added 20,966 new items to our collection
