You can choose to take the elevator or the stairs to the main floor.

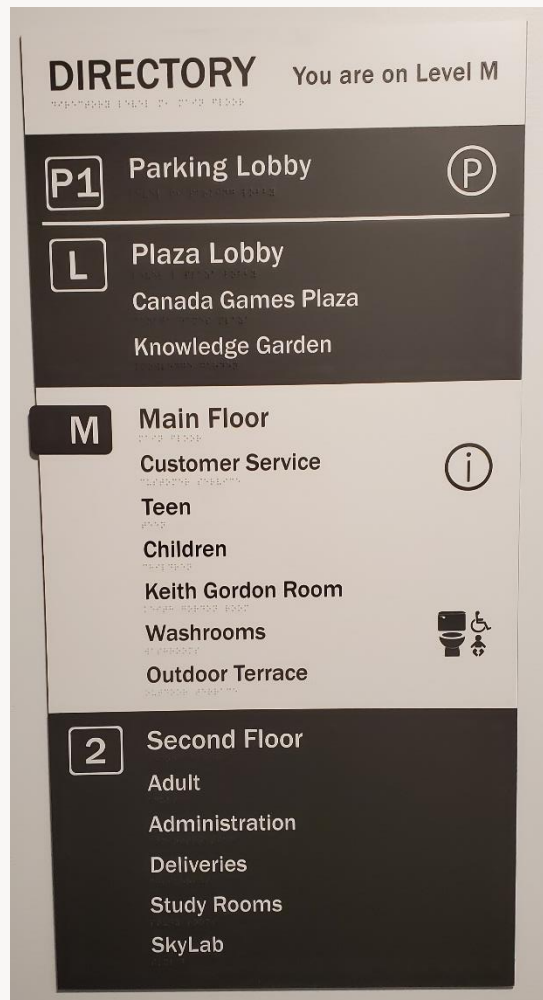


The elevator has glass doors.  
It has a speaker that tells you what floor  
you are on.

The staircase has many windows.  
It can be loud when it is busy.



There is a sign outside the elevator.  
It tells you what is on each floor of the  
library.





When entering the library's main floor to the left you will see a small security desk where you will occasionally see a security guard situated.

To the right is where you can return your borrowed items.



This is our amazing Teens Section. An area where teens can relax, hangout and read books.



The Service Desk is on the main floor.  
Staff at this desk can help you get a library  
card.

They can also help you find books, DVDs,  
and other library materials.



Sometimes there is a lineup at this desk.  
The stickers on the floor show you where  
to stand when you are in the lineup.



To get a library card, you will need to show staff a piece of identification.  
It must have your legal name on it.

This is what a library card looks like:



Children under 12 years old need a parent or guardian with them to get a library card.



Staff members wear silver badges with  
"Staff" written on them.



Staff like to answer your questions and can  
give you a tour of the library.

There are washrooms on the first floor. If you need help finding the washrooms, ask a staff member.



There is a private washroom with 1 toilet.  
Anybody can use this washroom.

The soap in the bathrooms has no smell.  
The hand sanitizer has a strong smell.

If you would like to use the bathroom ask security or the service desk and they'll open it for you.





The layout of the junior section has a range of books as well as fun areas for activities and places to read.





This is the Youth Services Desk. Staff at this desk can help you find books.



Library staff like to answer your questions and give you tours of the library.

There are plenty of new lounges and places to read by yourself or with friends and family.



To log-in to the computers use your library card and PIN number or ask staff at the Service Desk for a 30 minute guest pass.





This is the Adult Services Desk on the second floor. If you have any questions, you can ask the staff members at this desk.



Sometimes the staff members who sits at this desk will be away helping another person. They will be back soon.



The elevator can now be used to go from the second floor all the way to the parkade.



When you enter the second floor from the elevator you will see book displays on your left and right as well as books, CD's, and DVD'S straight ahead.

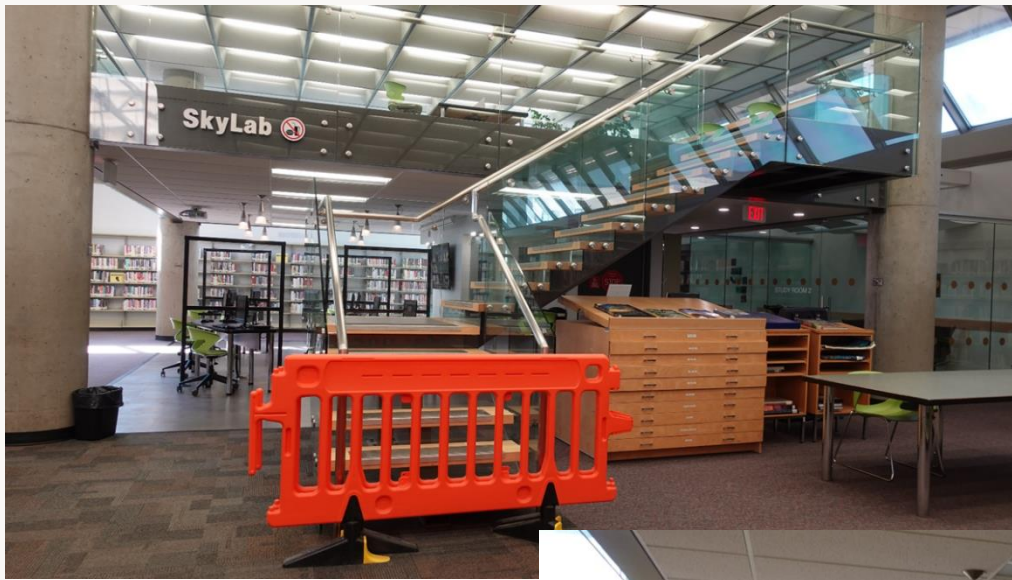




This beautiful area consists of magazines and trees. A great quiet place to read and feel close to nature.



The Skylab is currently closed and not available to the public however, you are more than welcome to use the computers underneath!

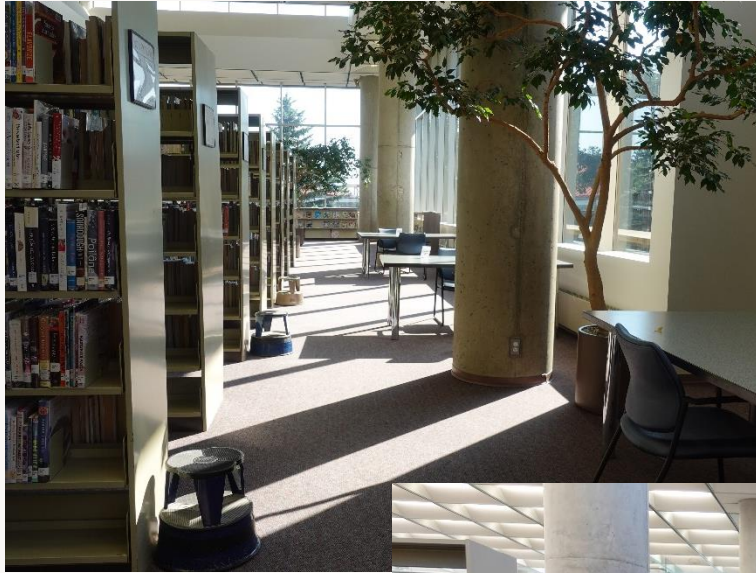




You can call and book a study room in advanced or come in and ask if one is available for use. A great secluded area for studying, tutoring and more.
